convention. The committee chair must report the notice to the Chairman of the Republican Party of Arizona on the day following the election. Chairman shall appoint a three-person dispute resolution committee made up of people who did not vote in the contest being disputed. This committee shall investigate as needed and within 20 days they shall vote to resolve the dispute. The decision of the dispute committee is final and non-appealable.

7. The agenda for the State Delegate Election Convention shall include in some order to be determined by the Chairman of the Republican Party of Arizona: a. Call to Order b. Pledge and Invocation c. Credentials Committee Report d. CD Balloting e. CD Tabulation f. Reporting of CD Election Results g. At-large Balloting h. At-large Tabulation i. Reporting of CD delegate results, At-large Results j. Election of National Committeeman and Committeewoman k. Tabulation of NCM/NCW Election I. Reporting of NCM and NCW Results m. Adjournment

The Chairman of the Party may invite such individuals as she deems necessary and appropriate to address the Convention from time to time. The election of National Committee representatives may occur out of order, at the discretion of the Chairman.

- 8. If a delegate comes to the virtual meeting, but must leave before casting a vote, he/she is required to notify a member of the credentials committee to facilitate seating of an alternate. No voter may cast more than one ballot.
- 9. To ensure the successful and timely delivery of delegates, and in the spirit of compliance with the Republican National Committee's 16(f) plan process, these rules cannot be altered or amended.
- 10. Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised 11th Edition, shall serve as the rules for the Convention except as modified by these rules.
